Dear Visitation Family,

Shalom (Peace)!

This Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time with the message of TRUST is preceded by the solemnities of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (Friday after Corpus Christi) and the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24) and is succeeded by the solemnity of the two principal patrons of the Church (June 29) Saints Peter (the "Prince of the Apostles") and Paul (the "Apostle of the Gentiles") which serve as perfect bookends to this week that is in the middle of the Fortnight for Freedom.

In recent days I have been saddened not only by the untimely death of some of my dear friends, but also by the horror stories that I read about some gruesome attacks on innocent Christians by some terrorist groups. One story said that in Iraq and Syria nearly 250 children, all under four years of age, were put in the dough mixer and kneaded to death. Another story was that the terrorists tortured a boy, while demanding that his father and two others renounce their Christian faith, before executing all four of them by crucifixion. Eight Christian women were publicly raped and beheaded. And the sad and horrible stories go on and on.

Today's readings and the fessts of Saints Thomas More, John Fischer, John the Baptist, Peter, Paul, The First Martyrs of the Roman Church, and Thomas the apostle in recent days remind us that the persecution of God's faithful is an ongoing story. But so also is God's faithfulness and fulfillment of His promise of salvation. And hence, our hope and joy!

"You have been saved by the grace of God in the person of Jesus Christ (Rom 5:12-15). Therefore, do not fear those who can take away your mortal life (Mt 10;26-33), for the Lord will protect and defend you (Jer 20:10-13 & Ps 69)" is the message of today's liturgy for every disciple of Christ growing in Faith and Service. Looking into the lives of prophets like Jeremiah in the first reading, or apostles like St. Paul in the second reading, or the God in human flesh, Jesus Himself, in the gospel, we who are called to SEE Jesus and BE Jesus are left with only one option to live: TRUST God. In the recently concluded 8 week Bible Study called "A Quick Journey through the Bible", Jeff Cavins singled out the lack of trust as the reason for all the woes of Israel throughout salvation history. Trusting in God is the key to happiness and the only required qualification to be a true disciple of Christ.

Trusting is especially necessary when we are faced with challenges and difficult choices. Trusting is not a passive verb, but it involves a personal and total commitment to accept and carry out God's Will joyously and lovingly. Here is Matthew Kelly's thought for us: "Why do we resist God? Because deep down we don't trust Him. Why do we cast God and his ways aside? Because deep down we think that God is trying to limit our freedom. Pray this novena for Trust: "Loving Father, I come to you today to make myself 100 percent available to you. I lay everything I have and everything I am at your feet. Take what you want to take, and give what you want to give, Command me in all things. I will do whatever you ask me to do. Transform me and transform my life, so that I may become the-very-best-version-of-myself and lead others to you with my life and my love" (Resisting Happiness page 176-177).


